The information contained in this log is to be posted on the OASIS or Internet website within 24 hours of when a Transmission Provider exercises its discretion under any terms of the tariff.

This amount will be determined from the current posted ATC's or, in the event they are not available for part or all of the period requested, they will be determined from a System Impact Study or a System Facilities Study preformed for the customer. The amount of firm transmission will be fixed for the term of the agreement. Any monthly variations may be handled through short-term firm transmission service requests on the OASIS. If the minimum ATC in any month during the period requested is zero, Southwestern will not offer any long- term firm transmission during the period. Instead, the customer will need to submit an OASIS request for short-term firm transmission service.
